
Leadership Nebraska City

The Impact of Class Projects

Class #1: Volunteered at the Jaycees Concession Stand during games; purchased a sign for the Cider House Theater at 15th Street and 1st Corso.

Class #2: Recovered dead trees from Wildwood Park and created two park benches; one is near the pond in Steinhart Park, the other is on the walking path at 4th Corso and 19th Street.

Class #3: Created Youth Leadership Nebraska City and conducted a year's worth of leadership sessions for 5 high school students.

Class #4: Made improvements at Friends of Faith thrift store in Nebraska City, including new dressing rooms, fresh paint, and a reorganized back room.

Class #5: Cleaned out and remodeled the tack room at Arbor Lodge State Historical Park.

Class #6: Created and installed a ceramic tile mural in Memorial Way, with scenes that correspond with the LNC curriculum.

Class #7: Replaced the roof and assisted with repairs at the Old Stone Cabin in Nebraska City.

Class #8: Erected a stage in Memorial Way and installed brick walkways. Sold personalized bricks to fund the project.

Class #9: Installed a marker and improved the landscaping at the Old Stone Cabin.

Class #10: Hosted a welcome reception for Class #11 to introduce them to Leadership Nebraska City alumni. Established a scholarship fund to help future students participate in the LNC program.

A Challenge for the Future

The Nebraska City Community Foundation Fund (NCCFF) has issued a challenge grant to Leadership Nebraska City, with guidelines as follows:

- Leadership Nebraska City raises \$10,000; NCCFF matches \$5,000.
- Once the minimum goal is met, NCCFF will match \$500 for each \$1,000 in additional funds raised by Leadership Nebraska City up to an additional \$5,000.
- Final goal: \$20,000 is raised by Leadership Nebraska City, NCCFF will match \$10,000.
- Total Amount Raised: \$30,000





A Timeline for Success

Great ideas become reality through careful planning and focused execution, and achieving a Leadership Nebraska City Endowment Fund is no exception. Here, a summary of key points in the timeline:

March 2015:

Class #10 creates plan to leave a lasting legacy for Leadership Nebraska City. Their goal: raise \$1,250 for scholarship fund.

May 2015:

Class #10 raises \$750 from Alumni for scholarships.

August 2015:

Class #10 applies for \$500 grant from Nebraska City Community Foundation Fund (NCCFF).

October 2015:

NCCFF recognizes an opportunity for greater impact; issues a challenge grant to Leadership Nebraska City organization.

November 2015:

LNC Advisory Committee revises the group's mission and vision statements, finalizes the strategic plan.

December 2015:

NCCFF begins training program with Leadership Nebraska City on how to build endowment fund.

February 2016:

LNC Advisory Committee pledges \$3,425 to the fund.

March 2016:

Leadership Nebraska City hosts alumni reunions, informs attendees of the challenge grant campaign.

May & June 2016:

Information about the campaign is released to the public; donor prospects are approached for their participation.

End Goal:

\$30,000 in Endowment Fund — \$20,000 raised by LNC; NCCFF contributes \$10,000 match.
